Abstract

The study seeks to analyze what happens to tribal societies when exposed to various forces of social change. The study was conducted on the Bhil tribe in District Udaipur, Rajasthan during 1999 and 2004. The emphasis has been on change taking place within their social structure. The villages were selected not on the basis of any sophisticated sampling techniques but on the basis of the concentration of Bhil population, and their vulnerability to exogenous factors of social change. Emphasis has been given to the historical facts which have imparted their effect on the social structure of the Bhil. It analyzes social, economic and political change and to unravel some of these complex inter-relationships between the traditional and the contemporary realm.
